Preserved Land on Arbutus Lake!

Recently, Amanda Macaluso and Dave DeLuca met with a representative from the Grand Traverse Land Conservancy to learn about the efforts to preserve 120 acres on Arbutus Lake.

Located across the lake from AHWH (to the northwest) the proposed Turtle Cove Nature Preserve is located between a public park and a state forest campground and includes a diversity of habitats and some incredible views.

More importantly, the protection of this parcel will help to slow development of the Arbutus Lake shoreline, a matter of prime concern to area residents. The Land Conservancy is working to raise the \$2.4 million required to secure the property.

Arbutus-Hayo-Went-Ha campers of yesteryear may recall going turtle-hunting in the area. Once the property is preserved, it may open such reptile-chasing to a whole new generation of campers!

Y-USA Access Grant Received – and Another Challenge Put Forth!

Earlier this month we received notification that Hayo-Went-Ha Camps was successful in its grant proposal to the YMCA of the USA for a Camp Access Grant. We will receive \$12,500 to be used to provide camp experiences to first-time campers whose families could otherwise not afford our camp tuition. The catch: We must raise an equal amount in gifts from our community by June 1 to secure the grant.

Now, coming to the rescue are AHWH summer staff members Carynn Jo Randolph and Cassie Sessler! Prior to camp, Cassie and Carynn are planning to hike a segment of the <u>Superior Hiking Trail</u> in Minnesota. The SHT follows rocky ridges above Lake Superior for most of its 310-mile length, from the

Wisconsin border all the way to Canada. Our intrepid hikers are planning to cover just about one hundred miles of trail... a distance that lends itself nicely to a campership fundraiser!

We're encouraging our community to support Cassie and Carynn (and our campership match challenge) by pledging an amount for each mile that they will hike.





For example, a \$0.50 a mile pledge would result in a \$50 donation to our campership fund – and get us closer to that Y-USA match!). We're also hoping to encourage our younger alumni – and other first-time donors – to support this initiative.
