We will get started at 9:00am on Saturday and work through to 5:00pm. We'll serve a light breakfast, a hearty lunch and quick dinner to our volunteers. There are also options for folks to arrive on Friday evening and/or stay until Sunday morning, but we won't be offering meal service on either day.
